

Returnee Entrance Exam B: Sample Questions

Until now, the B Test of the Returnee Entrance Exam of Senzoku Gakuen Junior High School has had three answer choices for all questions. From the test that will be held in January 2025, the B Test will have four answer choices for all questions. The total number of questions and the instructions in each section will not change. The B Test will continue to focus on grammar, word usage, vocabulary, idioms, and reading skills that less challenging than those found in the A Test.

To make certain that applicants taking the B Test have time to finish the exam, the readings in the final section of the test will be shortened from approximately 700 words to approximately 500 words.

Sample questions can be found below. (Sample questions for the reading section are not included.)
